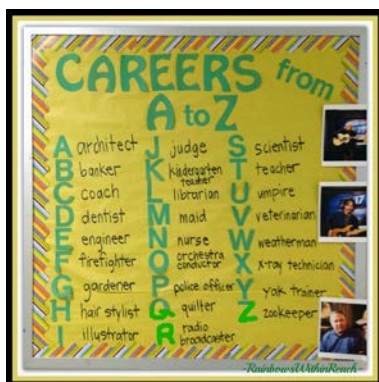

LCAP Goal 1 – College and Career Ready

LCAP Goal 2- Proficiency for All

During staff meeting and PLC this week, teachers reviewed and analyzed student progress as measured by the NWEA, MAP nationally standardized evaluation tool. Grade levels have written focus goals to prepare for the upcoming CAASPP based on NEWA and Smarter Balanced Interim results. Our school focus will be especially on math skill enrichment and review.

LCAP Goal 6- Additional Support

This week, several members of the Jack Francioni Family joined others in the district at a meeting to review the LCAP Goal 6 input from all stakeholders. All agreed that the meeting was a very productive first step in the revision process to align fiscal resources in support of the needs of our students in significant subgroups.

LCAP Goal 3- Safety

Securing buildings is only one piece of the school safety puzzle. Creating safer schools also includes a focus on strengthening relationships and helping students to understand what healthy relationships are and are not. We need to provide students with reporting tools that are effective, protect anonymity and build trust. The Sprigeo app addresses these needs and is on all SUSD student iPads.

Students are getting the message. This week, a student reported an incident as it was unfolding. Administrators and Counselors were able to address the issue in the moment. This is a huge win for the staff and students.

LCAP Goal 5- Retaining Qualified Staff

Despite increased success in attracting quality graduates into teacher education and growing support for the induction and mentoring of beginning teachers, it is well established that between 25 and 40 percent of all newly-recruited teachers resign or burnout within their first three to five years of teaching. A survey was conducted by a consortium of universities to explore the reasons for this trend. The survey found some issues that were consistently raised among new teachers across a broad range of school and community contexts.

- Adjusting to the demands of teaching full-time, especially classroom management
 - Negotiating colleague relationships
 - Understanding classroom, school and community cultures
 - Coping with self: Finding a niche
 - The idealism of the pre-service preparation.
- The data suggests that for a majority of respondents, their introduction into the first year of teaching is neither systematic or well planned and managed. They stress the importance of having a principal who has as a primary responsibility formal, systematic support.
